# **INTRAMURALS**

Intramurals are offered after school during the activity period that runs from 3:20 to 4:25 and will begin on Wednesday, August 30th. Generally, sixth grade meets on Monday, seventh grade meets on Wednesday, and eighth grade meets on Thursday. However, for certain sports, the activity sponsor may wish to invite students to stay for more than one day. The invitation to participate in intramurals is extended to any and all students.

All students wishing to participate should have tennis shoes and be appropriately dressed for the activity. A WATER BOTTLE IS STRONGLY SUGGESTED FOR ALL SPORTS, ESPECIALLY THOSE HELD OUTDOORS.

In-district tournaments with the other Parkway middle schools are offered for each grade level for certain sports. These events are coeducational and include: cross country, soccer, wrestling, basketball, volleyball, flag football, softball, and track. Tournament teams will be limited in size based on the nature of the sport being played, and will be selected by the activity sponsor using—in order—the following criteria: Following the Patriot Way, Attendance, and Skill.

Teams will be selected at least one week prior to the date of a tournament. While all students are still welcome to attend practice in the dates prior to the tournament, the tournament team will not be altered barring an athlete's inability to attend.

### **The Patriot Way**

All participants in intramural sports are expected to follow the Patriot Way at all intramural practices and District tournaments. Major violations of the Patriot Way at intramural practices or District tournaments will result in a referral to the school's administration for consequences up to and including suspension from after school activities as well as participation in District tournaments.

#### **Dismissal Protocol**

Due to the safety concerns present in sending a student away on the wrong bus, all activity sponsors and students are expected to follow the following protocol during activity bus dismissal.

- Students should take care of personal matters at the conclusion of their activity, fill out a bus pass, and immediately take a seat at the assigned table until they are dismissed by an activity sponsor.
- If students are unaware of their transportation home, they should immediately find an adult to help them.
- Activity directors will be readily available to field questions from students if they are unsure of the correct activity bus to ride.
- Activity directors will dismiss students for an activity bus once all students are seated, the bus has arrived, and the bus is ready to depart.
- Once dismissed by activity directors, students will clear any debris from their location, push in their chairs, and walk calmly to their bus. Students receiving a ride home from a guardian may leave at any time.
